WHEREAS, There is a need for lake access roads in Ottawa County,


THEREFORE, Be It Resolved, the Ottawa County Board of Commissioners have selected the following projects, in order of priority, to be considered for said lake access roads:


1. WILSON ROAD 1.6 MILES

10. SUNSHINE VALLEY ROAD .3 MILES





WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma adheres to the concept of Indian self-determination and desires to contract the **COMMUNITY SERVICES (CS) PROGRAM**;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Business Committee of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma authorizes the Chairman of the Business Committee, or his designee, to negotiate and execute the **COMMUNITY SERVICES (CS) PROGRAM** contract and any amendments thereof. The authorities granted herein shall remain in effect for the duration of the proposed contract. Commencement date of the contract shall be October 01, 1993 and continue through September 30, 1996.

WHEREAS, The Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized Indian Tribe and

WHEREAS, the Business Committee of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma, in accordance with the Quapaw Tribe Governing Resolution adopted August 19, 1956, is empowered to act on behalf of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS the Tribe recognizes that it is desirable and in the best interests of the members of the Tribe to consent to a cross deputization agreement between the Bureau of Indian Affairs and local law enforcement agencies to provide better and more adequate police protection to Tribal members on Indian Trust lands if the Tribe; and

WHEREAS such cross deputizaion agreements will provide that the Bureau of Indian Affairs will issue Bureau of Indian Affairs commissions to certain officers of local law enforcement agencies empowering and authorizing those officers to patrol, quell disturbances, make arrests, and to assist the Bureau of Indian Affairs police in providing law enforcement in Indian Country,


NOW BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma consents to such an agreement between the Bureau of Indian Affairs and local law enforcement agencies with the following express provisions and limitations:

1. Cross deputized local law enforcement officers may exercise all authority provided by the agreements on Indian Trust or Restricted lands owned by individual tribal members, only at the request of the individual owners or authorized representative.
2. Cross Deputized law enforcement officers may exercise law enforcement authority on tribal owned trust lands only when requested by a member of the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee or authorized staff, or by a BIA police officer or by the Commander of the BIA police.
3. Cross deputized officers must be C.L.E.E.T. certified.
4. The Tribe reserves the right to direct the BIA to cancel any individual cross deputization immediately upon receipt of Resolution.


5. The Tribe reserves the right to direct the BIA to cancel any cross deputization agreement upon receipt of the passage of a proper resolution.
6. No BIA cross deputization commission shall ever be construed as authorizing the enforcement of any state or local law on any lands within the Tribes jurisdiction that was not applicable before the execution of the cross deputization agreement or the issuance of the BIA cross deputization commission.
7. The Tribe expressly recognized that state and local law enforcement officers already have jurisdiction and authority to enforce state and local laws in Indian Country in cases where both perpetrators of crimes and the victims are non Indian or in cases where a non Indian perpetrated a victimless crime in Indian Country. In all other instances they will only have jurisdiction and authority to enforce applicable federal laws, regulations and Tribal Laws.
8. The issuance by the BIA of these commissions shall not confer any authority to enforce state tax laws, gaming regulations, laws or regulations or the various other state agencies.
9. The issuance by the BIA of these commissions shall not confer any authority to interfere in the business or conduct of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma.



WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized tribe eligible for program funds by authority of P.L. 93-638; and




