RESOLUTION NO. 110991C

Authority to negotiate, execute, and amend for the establishment of a CFR Court System.

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized tribe eligible for program funds, by authority of P. L. 93-638, and


WHEREAS, 25 CFR § 271.18 requires that before the Bureau of Indian Affairs can enter into a contract with a tribal organization, it must be requested to do so by the tribe to be served under the contract. It further states that the tribe's request shall be in the form of a resolution by the tribal governing body, and

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma adheres to the concept of Indian Self-Determination and desires the establishment of CFR Courts be initiated.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee authorizes the Chairman or his designees to negotiate the establishment of CFR Courts and any amendments thereof. The authorities granted herein shall remain in effect for the duration of a one year contract period for fiscal year 1992.

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Resolution No. 101291-B

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized Indian tribe, and

WHEREAS, that before the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma can enter into an agreement with an organization, it must request to do so by tribal resolution. Be it further stated that the tribe's request shall be in a form of a resolution by the tribal business committee, and

WHEREAS, please be advised, the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee met on Saturday, September 14, 1991 to consider the request of the Bureau of Indian Affairs to have tribal participation in the Deputy Special Officer (DSO) commissioning process, and

WHEREAS, the basic terms of agreement in the issuance of DSO commissions with tribal approval include the following conditions, and


WHEREAS, the conditions are as follows: 1. The tribe will submit a list of names of current law enforcement personnel with specific approvals. 2. The DSO commission will be limited to responding to offenses on Quapaw Indian Country Land on an as-called, as needed basis. 3. The DSO commission shall not be construed as authorizing the enforcement of State Law on Quapaw Indian Country Land. 4. The DSO commission shall only be construed as allowing enforcement of federal or tribal law., and

WHEREAS, the tribe is taking measures to draft tribal codes and ordinances in the law enforcement area. We will keep you informed of any codes and ordinances enacted by the tribe, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: the Business Committee is now willing to consider a written agreement incorporating the above conditions. The committee will await your response and will work with you in coming to a written agreement to accomplish the objectives of the Business Committee in the law enforcement area.
