


"To Acquire Funding for an Indian Child Welfare Program"


- WHEREAS: The Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized Indian Tribe, and
- WHEREAS: the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee is authorized to act on behalf of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS: there is a critical need to develop and provide training for Indian Families in the Miami Agency Service Area in the area of child abuse and child neglect thus improving the potential for dealing with these problems which consequently will facilitate the prevention of breaking up of Indian families, and
- WHEREAS: this program is submitted for consideration under the authority provided in P.L. 93-638, amended by P.L. 100-472, and P.L. 95-608, and
- WHEREAS: the Chairman and/or his designee is authorized to review this grant and any amendments thereto, and approve and sign narrative reports and fiscal management instruments, and
- WHEREAS: these authorizations shall remain in effect until such time as the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee chooses to withdraw said authorizations and to approve them by resolution.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma supports the Indian Child Welfare Grant application submitted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Miami Agency.


Whereas, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma wishes to convey their congratulations on the career achievements of Mrs. Carol Allen Green, and


Whereas, they are proud and honored that she represents herself, her family, and her people in this outstanding accomplishment as president of the Southwest Indian Polytechnic Institute.

In Support of Seneca-Cayuga Social Service Proposal

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is federally recognized by the United States Government for programs and services provided by the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and

WHEREAS, it has been indicated by the Quapaw Tribal members and members of other tribes that services of the Social Service element of the Miami Agency are not what they should be; and

WHEREAS, the Seneca-Cayuga Tribe of Oklahoma is endeavoring to contract the operation of the Social Services element; and


WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma feels that such action would result in improved services and attitude to the Indian people;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma, through its duly elected governing body, after consideration, does hereby submit this resolution in support of the Seneca-Cayuga Tribe of Oklahoma in its efforts to contract the Social Services program.

RESOLVED FURTHER, THAT this resolution shall remain in force for the period of three years, from October 1, 1990 until September 30, 1993, or until rescinded by resolution of the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee.

RESOLUTION REQUESTING A TWENTY-FIVE YEAR EXTENSION OF THE RESTRICTIONS ON LANDS OF THE QUAPAW INDIANS OF OKLAHOMA, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, passed an Act that all existing restrictions, tax limitations, and exemptions affecting lands of the Quapaw Indians in Oklahoma be, and the same are hereby, extended for a further period of twenty-five years from the date on which such restrictions, limitations, and exemptions would otherwise expire; Provided, however, That nothing herein contained shall be construed as preventing the Secretary of the Interior, in his discretion, from removing such restrictions, in whole or in part, upon application of any adult Indian owner of any such lands, on any interest therein, whenever the Secretary of the Interior finds it to be advantageous to the Indian owner to do so.

SEC. 2: That said restricted tracts of land or any part thereof, may be leased for business, mining, or other purposes in accordance with such rules and regulations as the Secretary of the Interior may prescribe, and not otherwise: Provided, however, That no lease, modification, or assignment thereof shall be made over the written protest of adult Indians owning a majority interest therein. (Approved July 27, 1939.)

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the restrictions be further extended for an additional twenty-five years from the expiration date, March 3, 1996, of this Act (H.R.3796 July 27, 1939) to March 3,

2021. This twenty-five year extension to be patterned after H.R.
3796 July 27, 1939.
