Authority to negotiate, execute, and amend the EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE FOR ADULT INDIANS PROGRAM contract.

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized tribe eligible for program funds, by authority of P. L. 93-638, and


WHEREAS, 25 CFR 271.18 requires that, before the Bureau can enter into a contract with a tribal organization, it must be requested to do so by the tribes to be served under the contract. It further states that the tribes' requests shall be in the form of a resolution by the tribal governing bodies, and

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma adheres to the concept of Indian Self-Determination and desires to contract the EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE FOR ADULT INDIANS PROGRAM.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Business Committee of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma authorizes the Chairman of the Business Committee, or his designee, to negotiate and execute the EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE FOR ADULT INDIANS PROGRAM contract and any amendments thereof. The authorities granted herein shall remain in effect for the duration of the proposed contract. The commencement date of the contract shall be January 1, 1988 and continue through September 30, 1988.


CERTIFICATION:

IN SUPPORT OF
INTER-TRIBAL COUNCIL, INC.
ANTI-DRUG ABUSE PROGRAM PROPOSAL

- WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized tribe eligible to contract programs from the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Indian Health Service, and
- WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma recognizes the value and benefit of Public Law 99-570, more commonly known as the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1986, to its members and other Indian people, and
- WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma believes that a joint effort of the local area tribes will be the most beneficial means of pursuing a program of services under Public Law 99-570, and
- WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma has been made aware that the Inter-tribal Council, Inc. wishes to submit a proposal for funding of an Alcohol and Drug Abuse program under Public Law 99-570, and
- WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is not now a member of the Inter-tribal Council, Inc.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma does desire to participate and establish a Tribal Action Plan for the Alcohol and Drug Abuse program under Public Law 99-570.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma does hereby support the member Tribes of the Inter-tribal Council, Inc. with the stipulation that the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma be allowed representation on the Coordinating Committee and necessary input to maintain a viable program of benefit to its members.

This action to remain in force until withdrawn by appropriate action of the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee acting in behalf of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma.

CERTIFICATION

The foregoing resolution of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma was adopted by a regular meeting of the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee on April 11, 1987, with 6 members present and voting reflecting 6 for, 0 against, and 0 abstentions.

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma is a federally recognized Indian Tribe and is organized with a Governing Resolution passed on August 19, 1956, by the Quapaw General Council, approved by the Commissioner of Indian Affairs on September 20, 1957, and

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma, through its duly elected Tribal Business Committee, has prepared an application under the Economic Development Grant Program for the purpose of business development of the Quapaw Tribal Convenience Center, and

WHEREAS, said application, if approved, will require the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma to arrange financing from other, non-BIA, sources for 60% of the total request, and


WHEREAS, said application, if approved, will receive 40% of the total request as a direct grant from the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma, through its duly elected governing body, after review of this, does hereby submit this resolution in support of its application for the development of the Quapaw Tribal Convenience Center.



- 1-14 Omnibus Bill resolution in support of Anti-Drug abuse act of 1986 discussed and approved.
- 2-14 Proposal to develop a Grant to BIA for 40% of Project and 60% from HUD to Tribal water tower, lift station, construction of convenience store, inventory and operating capital.
- 2-14 Correspondence to support retaining Oklahoma Indian Affairs Commission.
- 4-11 Resolution for flood relief assistance to renovate the bleachers and arena.
- 6-13 Resolution to contact for BIA contract was presented and approved. Community service, Adult Education, HIP, Employment assistance and vocational training.
- 6-13 A resolution asking for the resignation of Ross Swimmer to the collusion with the Governor of Oklahoma to take away Sovereignty of the Tribe.
- 8-8 Resolution adopted delegating Harry Gilmore as Quapaw Tribe representative to NCAI.
- 9-19 Resolution 91987 A in support of tribal Business Committee 1988 Budget in the amount of \$5,633.00.
- 9-19 Proposal 91987 B in support of opposing desecration of Indian Burial Grounds in the Grand Village of Illinois.
- 9-19 Resolution 91987 C in support of the Library Grant in the amount of \$3,750.00.
- 11-14 Resolution 111487 A stipulating that based on membership, regardless of residency tribal members are eligible for IHS and that enrollment card of the Quapaw Tribe be the basis for Tribal Eligibility.

In Support of Seneca-Cayuga Social Services Proposal



- WHEREAS, it has been indicated by Quapaw Tribal members and members of other tribes that services of the Social Service element of the Miami Agency are not what they should be; and
- WHEREAS, the Seneca-Cayuga Tribe of Oklahoma is endeavoring to contract the operation of the Social Services element; and,
- WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma feels that such action would result in improved services and attitude to the Indian people;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma, through its duly elected governing body, after consideration, does thereby submit this resolution in support of the Seneca-Cayuga Tribe of Oklahoma in its efforts to contract the Social Services program.


