RESOLUTION FOR NCAL MEMBERSHIP

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma has been and wishes to continue to be a Member Tribe of the National Congress of American Indians; and

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe meets all requirements for Tribal Membership pursuant to the Constitution of NCAL (Article II, Sec. 1, b);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Business Committee of the Quapaw Tribe hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Tribe to join the National Congress of American Indians; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Tribal funds in the amount of \$72.50 based on the Tribal Membership dues schedule of the NCAL By-Laws (Article III, Sec. 1, b), are authorized to be paid for such Tribal Membership; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that based on membership of 950, as verified by BIA records, the Tribe shall have 110 votes according to the NCAL Constitution (Article IV, Sec. 3); and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article V, Sec. 2 of the Constitution, the Tribe designates Robert Whitebird, Sr. a member of the Quapaw Tribe who is a member of NCAL in good standing, to be its official representative to NCAL, and designates George McWatters, Jr. also a member of the Quapaw Tribe and an individual member of NCAL in good standing, to be the alternate representative.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 27 does propose to move the Bureau of Indian Affairs from the Department of the Interior to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and

WHEREAS, the General Council of the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma, does feel this would do nothing more than disturb self-determination which is in current progress, and

WHEREAS, in any action taken it is suggested that a separate agency be established providing a Department of Indian Affairs with the Secretary of that Department having Cabinet status,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Quapaw Tribe of Oklahoma does oppose Senate Bill 27 in its present form.

TRIBAL RESOLUTION NO. 3-2-75

- WHEREAS, the United States of America, Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration offered to make the Quapaw Tribe, Quapaw, Ottawa County, Oklahoma by instrument dated January 23, 1974 a grant to aid in the construction or equipping of the public works portion of an industrial park on Tribal Trust Land; and
- WHEREAS, the duly elected Chairman of the Quapaw Tribe did except on behalf of the Quapaw Tribe, Quapaw, Ottawa County, Oklahoma, the offer of grant on December 4, 1974 signature of such instrument; and
- WHEREAS, necessary administrative, legal and contractual work has been accomplished, creating necessary allowances expenses over the past twenty-four (24) months; and
- WHEREAS, compensation has not been made for such services rendered by individuals project over this period of time; and
- WHEREAS, disbursement of project funds for approved project costs has not occurred to this date; and
- WHEREAS, it becomes necessary to secure necessary funds through the process of interim financing for such approved project costs, until such disbursement, through the incurrence of the proceeds of NEA Grant #01-1-01510
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, at a special meeting called by the Chairman of the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee, governing body of the Quapaw Tribe, assembled in Quapaw, Ottawa County, Oklahoma, this 2nd day of March 1975,

at which a quorum being present, authorization is hereby given to Jesse McIbuen, Chairman of the Quapaw Indian Tribe of Oklahoma and Lloyd Buffalo, Business Manager of the Quapaw Indian Tribe of Oklahoma, the power to incur the proceeds of EDA Grant #0 -1-01510 for such interim financing up to the amount not to exceed \$100000.00.
