RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Indian Tribe of Oklahoma has had a contract/grant for the operation of a Tribal Office through the Tribal Government Development Program of the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs during FY73 and FY74, and,

WHEREAS, these two contracts constitute a time element of only sixteen months, at the expiration of the current contract period and,

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribal Government Development Program has been an important factor in the Quapaw Tribe obtaining a grant of \$437,000 from the Economic Development Administration for the public works portion of an Industrial Park on Tribal Trust Land, and,

WHEREAS, this Industrial Park will effect the economic and social growth of the entire area as well as the Quapaw Tribe, and,

WHEREAS, the administrative work necessary to follow through on the Industrial Park will entail many man-hours, and,

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribal Funds are very minimal and insufficient to carry on the necessary administrative work, necessary to follow through on the Industrial Park project to total completion, and,

WHEREAS, recent guidelines for FY75 Tribal Government Development contracts tend to indicate that contracts will be limited to a total of two, and,


WHEREAS, operation of the Quapaw TGDP Office has been hampered during the current contract by the low-level of funding, and,

WHEREAS, various members of Congress and Congressional Committee members have been notified of the Quapaw Tribes situation, and,


WHEREAS, all replies have been in support of a Tribal Government Development Program renewal for the Quapaw Indian Tribe of Oklahoma, and,

WHEREAS, a proposal for FY75 TGDP funding is currently on File at the Tribal Operations Office, United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Washington, D.C., and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee in a regular business meeting March 16, 1974, voted to unanimously support the FY75 TGDP proposal and urge that an exception to the guidelines be implemented in the case of the Quapaw Tribe and that the highest consideration and priority be placed on the Quapaw proposal.

- 1.-- Administrative work necessary to Economic Development Grant.
Deliverable:- Progress Reports in compliance with contract.

* Estimated cost: \$14,000.00 of total proposed budget.

- 2.-- Develop and implement a Tribal personnel management system including position descriptions, salary schedule and policies for handling sick leave, vacations, promotions, hiring and firing.
Deliverable:- Report outlining the system.

* Estimated cost: \$7,000.00 of total proposed budget.

- 3.-- Seek out possible industrial facilities for the Quapaw Industrial Park.
Deliverable:- Progress Reports in compliance with contract.

* Estimated cost: \$7,000.00 of total proposed budget.

- 4.-- Miscellaneous and normal administrative operations.

* Estimated cost: \$7,000.00 of total proposed budget.

- 5.-- Expense for Tribal Business Committee.

Cost: \$3,000.00 of total proposed budget.

* Estimated costs are based on proportional shares including all cost such as; salaries, insurance, office expenses, travel expenses, etc.

WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribe feels that no inter-tribal group can place policy or make decision on any particular Tribe, by using that Tribe's name to seek program monies, and

WHEREAS, Tribal Sovereignty and integrity is the utmost legal relationship with the Federal Government under treaty law,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that any Inter-Tribal actions which affect ALL or ANY particular Tribes; receive individual Tribal support on proposals and program policies by individual Tribal Resolutions.

Passed this 16th day of March 1974; in a regularly scheduled meeting of the Quapaw Tribal Business Committee.

R E S O L U T I O N

February 28, 1974

Prior to allocation of any funds under the Comprehensive
Employment and Training Act of 1973, the undersigned
Oklahoma Indian Tribes request the following:

1. Indian desk in Department of Labor to deal directly with Tribes.
2. No approval by the Governor of Oklahoma. No money sent to State Government.
3. No supervision of proposals by Regional Offices; too much chance to have proposals and money lost in the shuffle.
4. All federally recognized tribes in Oklahoma come under same status as reservation tribes in United States.

Five Tribes in caucus: Quapaw, Wyandotte, Delaware,
Cherokee, and Osage.
