

RESOLUTION

At a meeting of the Quapaw Tribal Council held at the
Stump Grounds at Devil's Promenade in Ottawa County, Oklahoma,
on the 15th day of June, 1938, the following resolution was
offered and carried unanimously by the Tribal Council:

"WHEREAS, it has been called to the attention of the
Quapaw tribe of Indians in Ottawa County, Oklahoma, that aid
can be secured from the United States Government through
its duly authorized agency, the Civilians Conservation
Corps Indian Division, alphabetically known as the
C. C. I. D., for work on community property owned by the
Quapaw Indians and permanent improvements made thereon,
AND WHEREAS, the Quapaw Tribal Council has funds on hand
with which to buy a certain tract of land described as
follows:

Northeast Quarter (NE/4) of South-
East Quarter (SE/4), Section Six
(6), Township Twenty-eight (28)
North, Range Twenty-four (24) East,
Ottawa County, Oklahoma, containing
Forty (40) acres more or less,

for the use and benefit of the members of the Quapaw tribe
on which the improvements and work above mentioned can be
made, it being understood that the premises above mentioned
shall be used for a general meeting and camp ground for
all members of the Quapaw tribe.

"NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Secretary of our
Tribal Council be and is hereby requested to transmit a copy
of this resolution to the Superintendent of the Quapaw
Indian Agency with the request that the same be forwarded
to the Secretary of the Interior asking that authority be
given to the Quapaw Tribal Council to purchase said tract
of land for the use and benefit of Quapaw Indians, title
to said land being taken in the name of the United States
Government, to be held in trust for the Quapaw tribe of
Oklahoma with the customary restrictions on alienation."
